Simple Present			
Affermative	Interrogative	Negative	Interrogative -Negative
I have ('ve) got	Have I got ?	I have not (haven't) got	Have I not (Haven't ...) got ?
You have ('ve) got	Have you got ?	You have not (haven't) got	Have you not (Haven't ...) got ?
He/She/It has ('s) got	Has he/she/it got ?	He/She/It has not (hasn't) got	Has he/she/it not (Hasn't ...) got ?
We have ('ve) got	Have we got ?	We have not (haven't) got	Have we not (Haven't ...) got ?
You have ('ve) got	Have you got ?	You have not (haven't) got	Have you not (Haven't ...) got ?
They have ('ve) got	Have they got ?	They have not (haven't) got	Have they not (Haven't ...) got ?

THE VERB "TO HAVE" (2)

Simple Present

I have	Do I have ?	I do not (don't) have	Do I not (don't ...) have ?
You have	Do you have ?	You do not (don't) have	Do you not (Don't ...) have ?
He/She/It has	Does he/she/it have ?	He/She/It does not (doesn't) have	Does he/she/it not (Doesn't...) have ?
We have	Do we have ?	We do not (don't) have	Do we not (Don't ...) have ?
You have	Do you have ?	You do not (don't) have	Do you not (Don't ...) have ?
They have	Do they have ?	They do not (don't) have	Do they not (Don't ...) have ?

I've got a cat.
 Es. **Have** you **got** a dog?
 They **haven't got** much time.

I **have** a cat.
Do you **have** a dog?
 They **don't have** much time.

Hai un cane?
