The conjunction “ as ”		The preposition “ like ”	
+ subordinate clause	ex. He did as he had promised. <i>tr. Fece come aveva promesso.</i>	+ nouns	ex. He dresses like a tramp. <i>tr. Si veste come un vagabondo.</i>
+ noun “in qualità di”	ex. He worked as a carpenter. <i>tr. Lavorava come carpentiere.</i>	+ pronouns	ex. I’ve never met a man like him <i>tr. Non ho mai ... un uomo come lui</i>
as if / though	ex. You look as if you’re tired. <i>tr. Sembri (come se fossi) stanco.</i>	as an alternative to “for ex.”	ex. Victorian writers like Dickens <i>tr. Scrittori Vittoriani come Dickens</i>
Particular expressions			
as agreed	<i>come d’accordo</i>	What’s she like?	<i>tr. Com’è? (personalità, carattere)</i>
as it is	<i>in realtà</i>		
as follows	<i>come segue</i>	What does she look like?	<i>tr. Com’è? (aspetto fisico)</i>
as usual	<i>come al solito</i>
